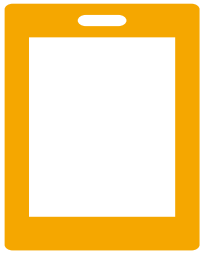

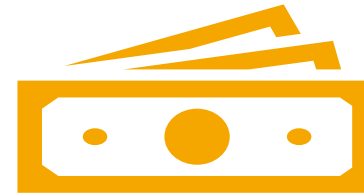

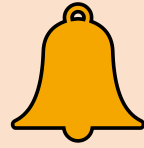

Share social media and other **communications materials**

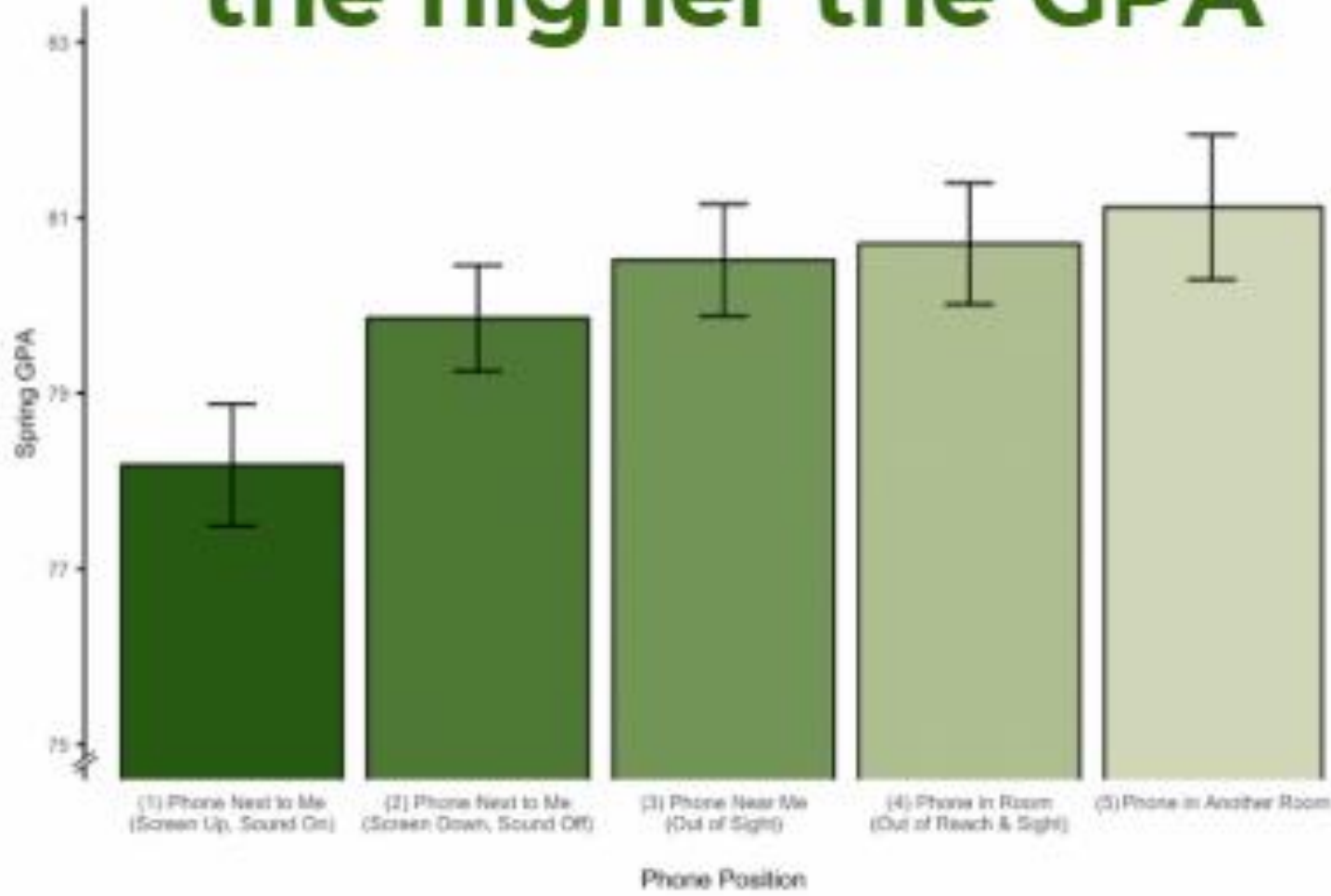
Support parent engagement

The farther the phone, the higher the GPA

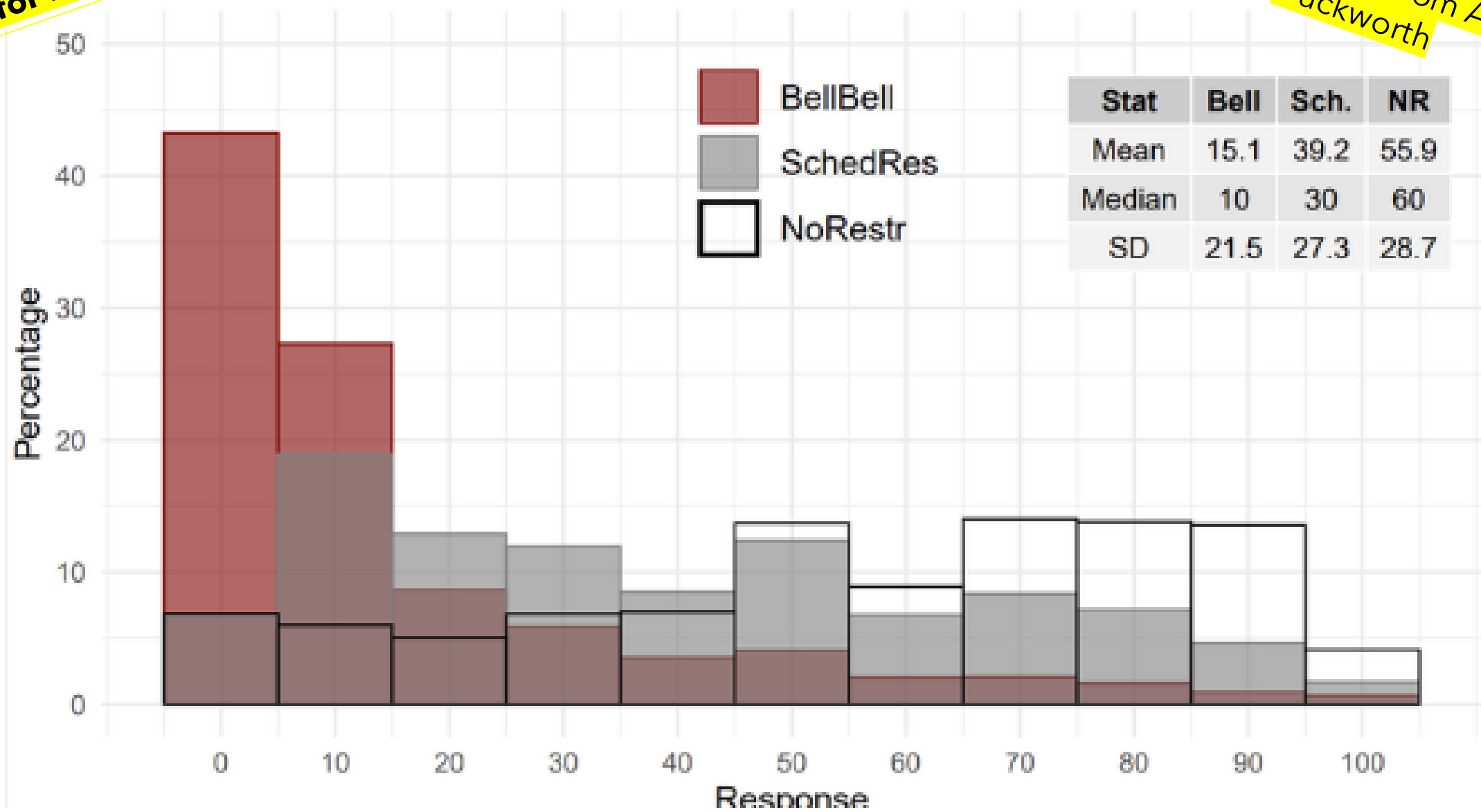

 Sample Size = 20241

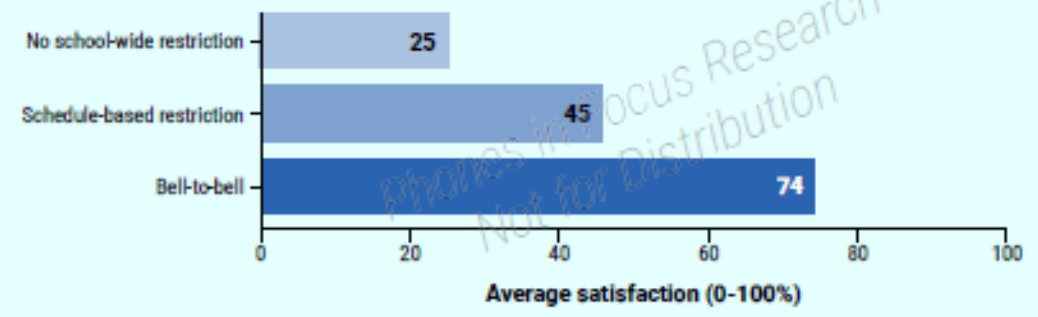
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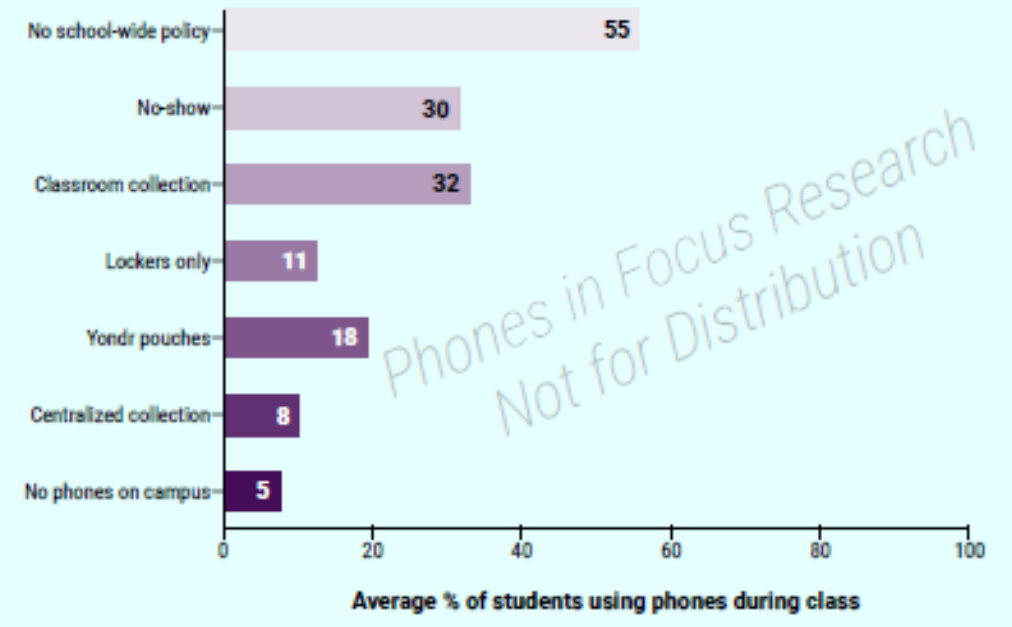
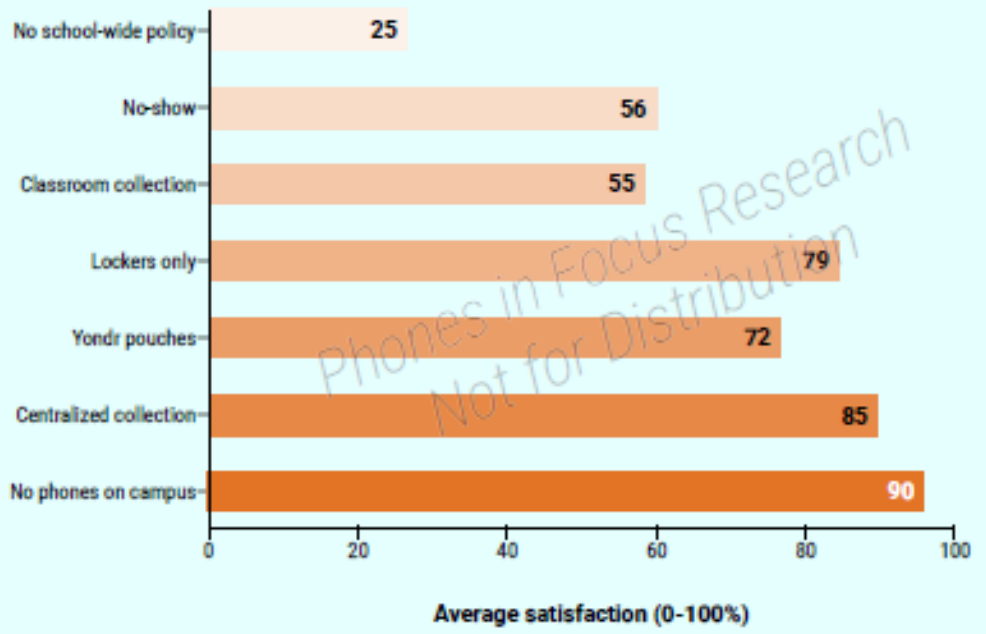
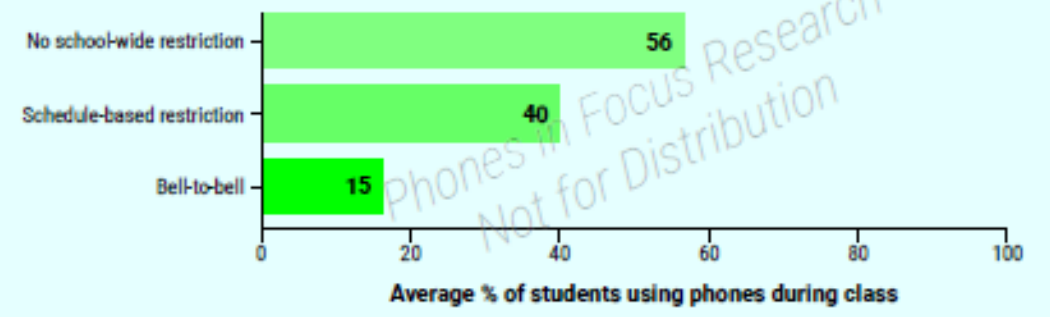

During class, about how many students are using their phones for personal reasons (for example, texting, social media)? Give your best guess.

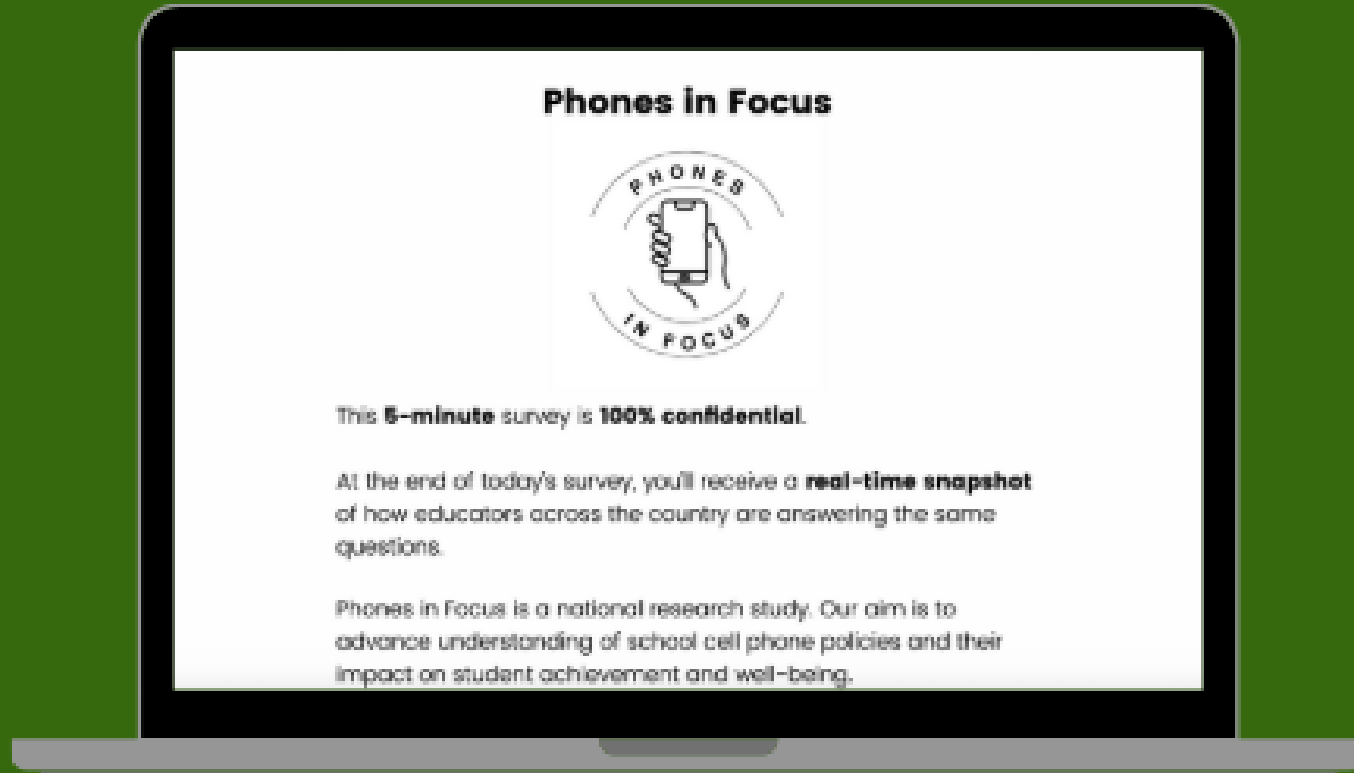

BELL TO BELL CELL PHONE BANS KEEP STUDENTS SAFE!

FOUR REASONS STUDENTS ARE LESS SAFE
WITH PHONES DURING EMERGENCIES

Kids need to pay attention to instructions from teachers and first responders, not their phones.

If kids need to hide the light from their cell phone draws attention to them.

Cell phones clog up bandwidth, making it harder for teachers to communicate with first responders.

Parents coming to the school prevents first responders from responding as quickly due to traffic jams.
