OPPORTUNITY GAP: Together, these words showcase the disparity in access and ability to have a high quality education for some kids. And it's not the kids' fault.

In IPS schools, the educational opportunity gap is stark:



36.3% of white students passed both the English and Math sections of ILEARN




5.4% of Black students passed both the English and Math sections of ILEARN




8.3% of Latino students passed both the English and Math sections of ILEARN


And it's not the kids' fault.



Of the 3,525 Black IPS students who took the ILEARN, 191 passed both sections (ELA/Math).



Of the 3,410 Latino IPS students who took the ILEARN, 282 passed both sections.



Of the 2,369 white IPS students who took the ILEARN, 861 passed both sections.

White students in IPS are nearly 7 times more likely to test on grade level compared to their Black peers and 4 ½ times more likely to test on grade level compared to their Latino peers.

All children are capable of amazing achievement in the classroom. It comes down to the opportunities provided by our public education system. These public schools are all helping Black and Brown students achieve at rates much higher than the state average.

These public schools are far outpacing the state average ILEARN passing rates for ELA/Math

IPS partnerships with local public charter high schools are contributing to greater achievement for Black and Latino students in the district. On average, IPS innovation charter high schools are outpacing the state average for Black student outcomes on the SAT by 67%. This is evidence that partnership and collaboration in growing quality school programs can work to address the opportunity gap.
